

VISA REQUIREMENTS

AUSTRALIA

Foreign visitors (with the exception of those native to New Zealand) travelling to the Australian Grand Prix will need a visa for their trip. Visas can be obtained electronically without payment and are issued swiftly. Information on this can be found [here](#). For specific advice on obtaining a visa for Australia, we advise visiting the website of the Australian Embassy located in your own country.

BAHRAIN

Visas are required by all visitors to Bahrain except passport holders of the GCC States.

1. If you will be attending as a spectator, click [Apply for eVisa](#) to see details of the unsponsored visas currently available.
2. Visas are not valid for entry until 2nd April 2017. The visa cannot be used to enter Bahrain before this date.
3. Printed Grand Prix [application form](#) to be submitted at NPRA.

CHINA

With the exception of those from Hong Kong, Macau, or Taiwan, a valid visa is required when visiting China. Your passport should be valid for at least 6 months from the date of your visa application. You can apply for a visa at the nearest Chinese Embassy, the Chinese Consulate General, or the Chinese Visa Application Service Centre. More information can be found [here](#).

AZERBAIJAN

Persons who want to visit Azerbaijan will be able to get a visa in just 3 steps which is completely online:

1. Get started by going into the website www.evisa.gov.az for apply.
2. Submit necessary information to the system of ASAN Visa and pay the state fee online.
3. e-Visa will be sent to the email of the applicant within working 3 (three) days.

SPAIN

Passport holders from the USA, Canada, New Zealand, Australia, and the UK do not require a visa to enter Spain. By providing your valid passport upon entry, you will be granted up to a 90 day-stay in the country. Just provide your valid passport on entry and you'll be granted up to 90 days in the country. Spain is part of the Schengen Area, which comprises a list of 26 countries that have agreed to allow free movement of their citizens within this area as a single country and no internal borders.

MONACO

Passport holders from the USA, Canada, New Zealand, Australia, and the UK do not require a visa to enter Monaco. By providing your valid passport upon entry, you will be granted up to a 90 day-stay in the country. Just provide your valid passport on entry and you'll be granted up to 90 days in the country. Monaco is part of the Schengen Area, which comprises a list of 26 countries that have agreed to allow free movement of their citizens within this area as a single country and no internal borders.

CANADA

Canada provides visa-free entry (for up to 6 months) to citizens from 51 countries, including all member states of the European Union, the United States, Australia, New Zealand and Japan. For those who don't come from one of these 51 countries, you will require a Temporary Resident Visa (TRV) to enter Canada – in some cases this can be applied for online. FRANCE

Passport holders from the USA, Canada, New Zealand, Australia, and the UK do not require a visa to enter France. By providing your valid passport upon entry, you will be granted up to a 90 day-stay in the country. Just provide your valid passport on entry and you'll be granted up to 90 days in the country. France is part of the Schengen Area, which comprises a list of 26 countries that have agreed to allow free movement of their citizens within this area as a single country and no internal borders.

AUSTRIA

Passport holders from the USA, Canada, New Zealand, Australia, and the UK do not require a visa to enter Austria. By providing your valid passport upon entry, you will be granted up to a 90 day-stay in the country. Just provide your valid passport on entry and you'll be granted up to 90 days in the country. Austria is part of the Schengen Area, which comprises a list of 26 countries that have agreed to allow free movement of their citizens within this area as a single country and no internal borders.

BRITAIN

Citizens of America, Canada and Australia nationals don't need a visa to attend the British Grand Prix. Visitors from members of the Schengen Area, as well as natives from the Caribbean and South America do not require a visa either. For those attending the race from outside these area, a short-term visa may be required. Select your country [here](#) to see if one is required.

GERMANY

Passport holders from the USA, Canada, New Zealand, Australia, and the UK do not require a visa to enter Germany. By providing your valid passport upon entry, you will be granted up to a 90 day-stay in the country. Just provide your valid passport on entry and you'll be granted up to 90 days in the country. Germany is part of the Schengen Area, which comprises a list of 26 countries that have agreed to allow free movement of their citizens within this area as a single country and no internal borders.

HUNGARY

Passport holders from the USA, Canada, New Zealand, Australia, and the UK do not require a visa to enter Hungary. By providing your valid passport upon entry, you will be granted up to a 90 day-stay in the country. Just provide your valid passport on entry and you'll be granted up to 90 days in the country. Hungary is part of the Schengen Area, which comprises a list of 26 countries that have agreed to allow free movement of their citizens within this area as a single country and no internal borders.

BELGIUM

Passport holders from the USA, Canada, New Zealand, Australia, and the UK do not require a visa to enter Belgium. By providing your valid passport upon entry, you will be granted up to a 90 day-stay in the country. Just provide your valid passport on entry and you'll be granted up to 90 days in the country. Belgium is part of the Schengen Area, which comprises a list of 26 countries that have agreed to allow free movement of their citizens within this area as a single country and no internal borders.

ITALY

Passport holders from the USA, Canada, New Zealand, Australia, and the UK do not require a visa to enter Italy. By providing your valid passport upon entry, you will be granted up to a 90 day-stay in the country. Just provide your valid passport on entry and you'll be granted up to 90 days in the country. Italy is part of the Schengen Area, which comprises a list of 26 countries that have agreed to allow free movement of their citizens within this area as a single country and no internal borders.

RUSSIA

Most tourists travelling to the Russian Grand Prix will need to obtain a visa to enter Russia. [Here](#) you will find a list of ex-Soviet states which do not require a travel visa. In applying for a visa, you will first need to obtain a 'Tourist Voucher' and a 'Tourist confirmation' document stamped and signed by an authorized person. The price of a single-entry visa usually costs around \$160 USD. After your arrival in Russia, you must register your visa, which can be typically arranged by a hotel (more info [here](#)).

JAPAN

The majority of countries do not require an entry visa for Japan. Based on your nationality, temporary visitor status are usually valid for a period of up to 90 days. More information on if you require a visa can be found [here](#).

UNITED STATES

Australians, Canadians, and most Europeans do not need a visa to visit the U.S., as they are part of the visa waiver program. Check the list of Visa Waiver Program (VWP) countries [here](#). A machine-readable passport that is valid for at least six months from the date of travel is required.

MEXICO

Visas are not required by nationals from America, Australia, Britain, Canada or EU member states. You should obtain a landing card valid for 180 days from your airline on direct flights or at any port of entry. You must keep your landing card through your stay as you will have to present it when you leave. Information on those countries which do require a visa to enter Mexico can be located [here](#).

ABU DHABI

Passport holders from the following countries can enter Dubai or Abu Dhabi without the need to arrange a tourist visa in advance: Australia, Andorra, Austria, Brunei, Belgium, Bulgaria, Canada, Croatia, Cyprus, Czech Republic, Denmark, Estonia, Finland, France, Germany, Greece, Hong Kong, Hungary, Iceland, Ireland, Italy, Japan, Latvia, Liechtenstein, Lithuania, Luxembourg, Malaysia, Malta, Monaco, The Netherlands, New Zealand, Norway, Poland, Portugal, Romania, San Marino, Singapore, Slovakia, Slovenia, South Korea, Spain, Sweden, Switzerland, United Kingdom, United States of America and the Vatican State.

Those travelling to the Abu Dhabi Grand Prix will need to apply for a tourist visa prior to their trip. Passengers with Etihad Airways can often arrange their visas through the airline, similarly with hotels and travel agencies on your behalf.
